## June 26, 2018 Special Session Bonifay, Florida

The Holmes County Board of Commissioners met in a Special Session on the above date with the following members present: Commissioner Mickey Locke, Commissioner Clint Erickson, Commissioner Bobby Sasnett, Commissioner Phillip Music and Commissioner Danny Powell, Chairman of the Board.

Joey Marsh, County Coordinator and Brandon Young, County Attorney, were present.

Angie Purvee, Deputy Clerk, was present and kept the minutes.

Chairman Powell called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. He led the prayer and pledge.

Brandon Young, County Attorney, gave an overview of the previous attempts by the municipalities to revise the Interlocal Agreement for the Local Option Fuel Tax (LOGT). He advised that all parties had been informed of this Special Session in order to execute the updated agreement with the following agreed upon disbursement of the gas tax:

- County 85%
- Bonifay 10%
- Ponce de Leon 2%
- Esto 1%
- Noma 1%
- Westville 1%

Discussion included the following:

- Current agreement will end October 1<sup>st</sup>
- Consequences of not executing an agreement by the deadline
- Revised agreement is in effect for 5 years and then the use of the statutory formula will commence
- Westville's request for a delay to re-evaluate their portion of the funds
- Past attempts to implement the statutory formula

The following citizens discussed this matter:

Commission Erickson offered a motion to have the Chairman execute the revised Interlocal Agreement for the Local Option Fuel Tax (LOGT) with Commissioner Sasnett offering a second. The motion passed unanimously.
